Brief Biography

Tony Award winner Faith Prince can currently be seen in Showtime's critically acclaimed original series "**HUFF**". Prince stars as "KELLY KNIPERS", the lovable and quirky love interest of Oliver Platt. As always, Faith wowed the creator of this series who quickly turned this quirky character into a recurring role from what was originally supposed to only be a guest starring part. She can also be seen in the upcoming independent film "**OUR VERY OWN**," with Allison Janney and Cheryl Hines, and opposite Hilary and Haily Duff in their feature film "**MATERIAL GIRLS**."

Faith Prince can effortlessly move between film, television and theater. Last season she enjoyed a successful National City tour of "**Over The Rainbow**," a concert celebrating the centennial of Harold Arlen with Tom Wopat.

Since moving to Los Angeles last year, Faith has found success in television and film. Faith was also seen in the Award winning program "**Monk**" with Tony Shaloub on USA Networks, and she also appeared on FOX's new series "**House**."

Faith Prince is perhaps best known for her Tony-winning turn as the perennially unwed Miss Adelaide in the 1992 revival of **GUYS AND DOLLS**. She was also awarded the Drama Desk Award and the Outer Critics Circle Award for the same role. Her last appearance on Broadway was in 2001 in **NOISES OFF** with Patti LuPone and Peter Gallagher. Faith also starred on Broadway as Ella Peterson in the Comden and Green classic **BELLS ARE RINGING**, for which she received Outer Critics, Drama Desk and Tony Award nominations for her role.

Prince originated major roles in **JEROME ROBBIN'S BROADWAY** for which she received a Tony and Drama Desk award nomination, **NICK AND NORA** for which she won the Outer Circle Award and **LITTLE ME** with Martin Short. In 1997, Faith received critical raves for her portrayal of

Anna in the the revival of **THE KING AND I**. After starring in Broadway's James Joyce's **THE DEAD**, she reprised her role for the West Coast and Washington premieres and received an Ovation and Helen Hayes nomination. Faith originated the character of Trina in William Finn's **FALSETTOLAND**, and also appeared off-Broadway in **BAD HABITS**, **URBAN BLIGHT**, **GROUCHO**, **LITTLE SHOP OF HORROS**, **OLYMPUS ON MY MIND** and **SCRAMBLED FEET**.

Faith created the unforgettable role of Richard Kind's girlfriend/wife, Claudia, in numerous episodes of the hit series "**Spin City**" from 1997 – 1999. She also appeared on "**Now and Again**," with Bill Campbell and was featured in the PBS special "**My Favorite Broadway**," "**Welcome to New York**," "**Law and Order**," "**High Society**," "**Encyclopedia**," and the Hallmark Hall of Fame film, "**A Season for Miracles**." Faith's film credits include, "**Picture Perfect**," "**My Father The Hero**," "**Dave**," "**The Last Dragon**" and "**Big Bully**."

Faith also enjoys a career in recording, with an award-winning cabaret debut at Joe's Pub in New York City and the live recording of her first solo album, "**A Leap of Faith**," now available on DRG Records. She will be returning to the studio in the spring to record a second album.
